

Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for Railroad Bridge

A ribbon cutting ceremony for Phase One of the Newfolden Floodplain Mitigation Project was held on June 15. Representatives from across the state were present to celebrate the construction of the Canadian Pacific Kansas City Railroad Bridge. This is step 1 of removing all of Newfolden from the 100 year floodplain. The group of stakeholders present were provided a tour of Phase 2 of the project, a water impoundment site located just North of Newfolden. Speakers provided a timeline of the project and expressed appreciation for the teamwork of many organizations: Middle Snake Tamarac Rivers Watershed District, Red River Watershed Board, Minnesota Department of Transportation, HDR Engineering, regional legislators, and many more.

It is expected that Newfolden will officially be removed from the floodplain within the next several months.

PET ETIQUETTE AND PET ORDINANCE REMINDERS

Several complaints, regarding dogs and cats, come into the City office and the Marshall County Sheriff's Department throughout the year. These are the most common complaints.

If you are a pet owner, please remember these courtesies:

- 1. When walking your dog, bring along a rag and a bag to clean up any poot that your pet generates. Allowing a pet to 'go' freely on other people's property is a common complaint. Pet Bag Stations are now available along East First Street and in the Stan Holmaas City Park.
- 2. Dogs should be under the direct control of their owner at all times. If they do not obey commands, they should be leashed. Pets are not be allowed to run-at-large.
- 3. Frequent complaint are dogs who bark in a continuous manner. This is against city statutes after 10:00 PM. Please have your pets vaccinated annually.



MINNESOTA LEAD AND COPPER RULE - GET HELP REPLACING YOUR LEAD PIPING!

The Lead and Copper Rule is designed to protect children and families from exposure to lead in drinking water.

The State of Minnesota is working with municipalities to gather information relevant to the Lead and Copper Rule. The Lead and Copper Rule requires that community water systems test for lead in drinking water. The rule uses science-based testing protocols to help identify other potential sources of lead in drinking water.

Many homes and businesses across the United States have service lines made of lead; a toxic metal that is especially dangerous to young developing brains. The only long-term solution to protect public health is to remove these lead pipes and replace them with updated copper or plastic piping. Congress banned the use of lead pipes in1986 but did allow those already in the ground to remain.

The new rule requires that water systems identify the locations of lead service-lines. This will help establish a trigger level to jumpstart mitigation earlier and drive more and complete lead service-line replacement programs.

To determine what your service-line is made of, homeowners can check at the location of their water meter. The line coming in from outside the home and attached to the water meter, is the service-line in question. It will be comprised of copper, plastic, or a lead/metal material. We are asking homeowners to help us inventory the service lines within the City of Newfolden. Those with lead service lines may be eligible for financial assistance.

We are asking all property owners to complete the survey below and return to the City of Newfolden.
